

Points for the establishment of the Indigenous Student Resource Center at Yuan Ze University

Approved at the 7th Administrative Meeting of the 111th Academic Year on October 26, 111

Amended and passed in the 14th Administrative Meeting of the 112th Academic Year on March 13, 113

Amended and passed in the 22nd Administrative Meeting of the 112th Academic Year on July 10, 113

Article 1: Yuan Ze University, hereinafter referred to as "the university," aims to develop a campus characterized by multiculturalism and integrate internal and external resources. In order to provide guidance and enhance the learning effectiveness of indigenous students, the Indigenous Student Resource Center (hereinafter referred to as "the Center") is established in accordance with the Indigenous Education Act and Article 7 of the university's organizational regulations, under the Student Affairs Office.

Article 2: The primary missions of the Center are as follows:

1. To coordinate and integrate the University's cross-departmental Indigenous student affairs and resources.
2. To monitor and support the academic performance of Indigenous students at the University.
3. To care for and assist Indigenous students in adapting to campus life.
4. To promote and cultivate an Indigenous cultural environment, creating a diverse and distinctive campus character.

Article 3: The Center shall have one Director, who concurrently serves as the Dean of Student Affairs, overseeing the Center's operations. The Center may also have several staff members to assist with various programs and activities, who will be appointed from the University's existing personnel or hired on a contractual basis.

Article 4: The Center shall establish a Advisory Committee to provide consultation and evaluation on the Center's operations and development. The Committee shall meet at least once per academic year, with additional meetings called as necessary. The Advisory Committee shall consist of five to seven members, appointed by the University President upon the Center's recommendation each academic year. The term of appointment is one year, and members may be reappointed upon the expiration of their term. The composition of the Advisory Committee is as follows:

1. Ex-officio member: The Director of the Center.
2. Appointed members: External professionals, representatives of Indigenous students, or University faculty and staff with Indigenous

backgrounds.

3. Indigenous members must constitute at least one-third of the total number of committee members.

Article 5: These guidelines shall be implemented following approval by the Administrative Council, and the same applies to any amendments.
